### **Agency Updates**

Local Appropriations for FY19 – Jeff and I met with Bud Norman this week regarding FY19 local appropriations and have an appointment with Teresa Doehring and Ryan in St. Joseph County scheduled for August 14th. Jeff did request a meeting with Derek from Hillsdale County but nothing has been scheduled. I thought this would be a great opportunity for Jeff to personally meet the individuals in each county that work with county budgets. I was in attendance at the Hillsdale County Commission meeting this week and that board passed a resolution to support the health department at \$5.02 per person based on the 2010 census.

**FY19 Budget/FY19 Health Insurance** – The FY19 Budget was reviewed by the finance committee at their meeting with a recommendation by the committee to approve. The FY19 Health Insurance options were reviewed by the finance committee. The rates for our plans decreased this year by 1.75%. The finance committee moved to recommend the 80/20 rate be adopted for employee health insurance by the full board.

Request for Proposals Update – Electronic Medical Record (EMR) proposals were narrowed to three companies and those three were asked additional questions about their software. We definitely have one company that seems to rise above the others, but a final decision is still pending an in-depth demo of the product. Environmental Health software proposals have been received from four companies and are in the process of being reviewed. The RFP for cleaning services in the Hillsdale building are due on Friday.

**Meridian Health Plan** – We were recently notified by this health plan of a recoupment of funds from the Primary Care Provider Incentive Payment Program (PCP-IPP) for FY13 that needs to be made to Meridian. The amount they indicate we must pay back is \$12,515.09. We have checked our payments from this insurer and cannot verify receipt of this amount given the information that we have been provided. At this time, we are waiting for additional information from Meridian Health regarding this PCP-IPP. I will keep you informed.

**Center for Family Health (FQHC)** – We have received notification that they are closing their Hillsdale office on August 31<sup>st</sup>. The main office for the Center for Family Health is in Jackson County.

**Staff Vacancies/New Staff** – We have welcomed Brittany Hayes to Coldwater as Agency Support Clerk and Angela Beegle as the Breastfeeding Peer Support in St. Joseph County. The clinic clerk position that was open in St. Joseph County was filled by a staff member currently in Coldwater. This left an opening in Coldwater which the Agency is in the process of being filled.

**PFAS Testing** – Commissioner Vrablic shared concerns he has been presented with from community members in and around Coldwater who remember a shoe manufacturing facility in Coldwater. The citizens have voiced concern as they hear about the PFAS contamination from the shoe manufacturer located in Kent County and wonder if that same contamination may have occurred from this old manufacturing facility. This information has been shared with the DEQ and they have acknowledged receipt. Our 3-county area has not yet been sampled for PFAS. I have been informed by the DEQ that sampling in our area should be completed by December. Information on PFAS and any advisories for the public are being placed on the web at <a href="https://www.michigan.gov/pfasresponse">www.michigan.gov/pfasresponse</a>.

**Hepatitis A Outbreak** – As I have been reporting, Michigan is in the midst of a serious Hepatitis A outbreak. Current case count as of July 18, 2018 is 863 with 695 hospitalizations and 27 deaths. The case count continues to climb but has slowed, which is positive. The Agency continues to work to increase our vaccination rates for adult Hep. A, especially of the high-risk individuals. Cases of Hepatitis A are expected to occur in the summer

months when people are out with limited access to good personal hygiene (handwashing), I will continue to keep you informed as the summer progresses.

Hepatitis A vaccination is safe and effective. The following individuals should get the HAV vaccine:

- Persons who are homeless.
- Persons who are incarcerated.
- Persons who use injection and non-injection illegal drugs.
- Persons who work with the high-risk populations listed above.
- Persons who have close contact, care for, or live with someone who has HAV.
- Persons who have sexual activities with someone who has HAV.
- Men who have sex with men.
- Travelers to countries with high or medium rates of HAV.
- Persons with chronic liver disease, such as cirrhosis, hepatitis B, or hepatitis C.\*
- Persons with clotting factor disorders.

# Medical Director's Report to the Board of Health H. Lauren Vogel, D.O., M.P.H. Parent Education

Pediatrics utilization of emergency services is high. It's been estimated that about 95 percent of pediatrics care in the emergency department does not meet either urgent or severity care requirements. Emergency department utilization is a major driver of health care costs. The reasons for parents taking their child to an ER for care are several and these include convenience, perception of improved care and lack of access to private care.

Another important cause for ER utilization by parents is their inability to evaluate the severity of their child's illness. According to the 2003 National Assessment of Adult Literacy, more than 90 million Americans lack the necessary health literacy skills to effectively utilize the health care system.<sup>1</sup>

The Health Care institute at UCLA has developed an educational program for parents to help them better evaluate and treat non emergent illness in their children. The program was developed by Ariella Herman, Ph.D. from the UCLA Anderson School of Management and is delivered through the Head Start organization. Head Start and Early Head Start are national programs that provide comprehensive services to economically disadvantaged children from birth to age 5. Head Start programs promote school readiness and support the needs of the whole child, including physical, dental, and mental health, as well as nutrition services.

The UCLA program endeavors to empower Head Start parents by training them on the use of a low-literacy health book and to respond appropriately to common childhood illnesses and symptoms, with the goal of reducing the likelihood that parents would go unnecessarily to the doctor or emergency room for routine ailments affecting their children.

The book, "What To Do When You Child Is Sick" is part of the training program. This book is one of several easy to read and access texts for the public to help understand basic medical care. <sup>1</sup> When the educational program was provided in California, a 58 percent decrease in ER visits was documented. There was also a 29 percent decrease in missed school days and a 42 percent decrease in work days missed.

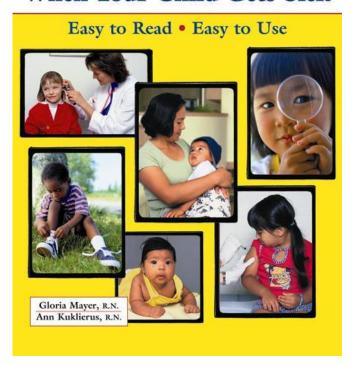
Branch County Early Head Start (BCISD EES Head Start and Great Start Collaborative) will provide the educational program for parents that includes a training session, a kit with the book and several home care supplies and includes dinner and child care as needed. Head Start plans trainings in October, February and May 2019. The kit provides a digital thermometer and the program provides parent education on how to use the thermometer and a detailed demonstration on how to use the book. Also part of the educational program are child safety and injury prevention with sections on ingestions, car safety and some basic CPR information.

The <u>What To Do When Your Child Is Sick</u> book is commercially available<sup>2</sup> and would be an important addition to every parent's home resources for health care. #### Branch-St. Joseph Area Agency on Aging 3C ~ History of Local (County) Appropriations

FY1996-1997 (FY97) was the first fiscal year of designation for the Branch-St. Joseph Area Agency on Aging (Region IIIC). Local appropriations are required for compliance as a designated AAA. We use appropriations to match federal and state funding allocated to us via the Aging and Adult Services Agency. Local appropriations are also used administratively for AAA operations, including the Community Living Program, which is offered in both Branch and St. Joseph Counties.

In FY97 each County Commission allocated \$12,000 to support the federal and state match requirement for all federal/state funds awarded to the AAA. It also supported one full-time Coordinator/AAA operations.

In FY04 the calculation of how the \$24,000 appropriations were split changed to model the area agency's allocation method for state/federal grant funds: 42% Branch Co. 58% St. Joseph County Branch \$10,409
St. Joseph \$13, 591
Total \$24,000

#### From FY97-FY09 the total allocation remained at \$24,000 (13 years)

(Note: In FY05 we were awarded the Community Living Program (State Care Management) grant and with that came 2FTE, as required by standards, yet we didn't request county allocation increases.)

In FY10 we requested a 20% increase in the County allocations. Total: \$29,918 Due to development of CLP and operational cost increases.

Since FY10, allocations have been: Branch Co. \$12,929 St. Joseph Co. \$16,989

#### From FY10-18 the total allocation remained at \$29,918 (8 years)

We would respectfully request an increase, starting in FY2019, of 20% from Branch and St. Joseph County.

This is a \$5,984 total increase.

Branch Co. \$12,929 x 20% = \$2,586 TOTAL: \$15,515
St. Joseph Co. \$16,989 x 20% = \$3,398 TOTAL: \$20,387

Grand Total: \$35,902

#### Rationale:

- The older adult population has grown 4% over the past 5 years, whereas the overall population has decreased.
- We have documented increase in demand for the Community Living Program, which utilizes 2 part time Social Workers and 1 full time nurse. These staff drive across 1,041 square miles to serve over 110 participants each year.
- Health care insurance costs have grown, complexity of CLP cases and increased number of referrals from APS also equate to higher operational costs.

#### Commissioners,

We have received our health insurance renewal quote, the premiums have dropped by 1.75%. This is a savings of \$7,656.48 (assuming all employees stay on the same plan) for the fiscal year.

In addition, a Hard Cap vs 80/20 cost sharing plan were compared. The most cost-effective plan would be to stay with the 80/20.

We also had a couple different high deductible plans quoted (\$2,000 and \$2,500) and calculated the cost if our agency adopted those plans, given that a Health Savings Account would be opened for each associate taking the insurance. We've found that option does not make sense and would cost the agency more than going with the renewal.

The Finance Committee recommends renewing our same coverage under the 80/20 cost sharing plan.

### July 26th, 2018

### **Communicable Disease: (CD-TB-HIV-STD):**

- ❖ I am still working on methods to make the data we provide monthly more meaningful. There will be some changes in what is reported, less duplication, and if there is anything specific you would like to hear about monthly, please let me know.
- ❖ Hillsdale is going to the Women's Hope House on July 19<sup>th</sup> to provide Hep A and other vaccinations to 10 out of 14 women who were at the Hepatitis presentation on July 2<sup>nd</sup>.
- Branch is offering a new service to the DHHS clients who are required to have random drug testing done. Five staff have been trained to provide this testing procedure.

### **Immunizations:**

- ❖ We are anxiously awaiting the changes that are coming this fall related to FERPA (Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act.) It could affect the ability to share immunization information between us and the schools. This will create a definite hardship when reporting time comes around.
- We are thinking of reporting immunization rates and waiver rates vs. the number of vaccines given.

# Women, Infants, and Children's Nutrition Program (WIC):

- WIC participation is about the same.
- Hillsdale is planning a special fun summer clinic on a Saturday for both WIC and Immunizations. We are planning to have a Project Fresh Vendor at the agency so their coupons can be redeemed right on site. Center for Family Health and CAA (Angela Turner) Family Engagement Specialist will also be joining us.

# Children's Special Health Care Services (CSHCS), Lead, and Hearing and Vision:

- CSHCS are planning on being at Polish Festival this week and are going to the Branch County Fair promoting the program. They will be interviewed by the radio station WIN 98.5 so they can promote their program and commercial ads will also be run throughout the week.
- ❖ We helped an Amish family in Camden that have two children with Muscular Dystrophy, apply for Children's Special Needs Funds through the state and they were awarded the \$14,000 needed to have a handicap buggy built for the family. It is lower to the ground so the children do not have to step so high to get in. It also has a box in the back to store wheelchairs. This was actually done last year, but the family was just notified the construction is complete and are going to be receiving it in the next couple of weeks.

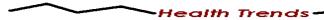

#### **Food Service Sanitation**

The new temporary food policy is being promoted by our food staff as they have been making their temporary food inspections. We also hand out a copy the new policy with every temporary food application and have placed the policy on our web-site. To this point we have not gotten any negative feedback regards to the 2-day minimum notice requirement that was added. We have had



in

couple of comments on the non-profit status requirements. The new policy will require a copy of a 501 (C) 3 designation in order to qualify for the non-profit license fee. The 501 (C) 3 is a designation for tax exempt, charitable organizations. We have been encouraging those charitable organizations that don't have the 501 (C) 3 designation to look into applying for that designation if they wish to qualify for our reduced license fee.

### Well & On-Site Sewage

The numbers of permits and inspections for wells and septic systems have been keeping pace with the numbers from last year, which were the highest since before the housing market crash. We have seen a lot of lake front properties come in with proposals for additions to existing structures or proposals for tear down and re-builds. Many of our lake front properties have very small lots that challenge the space requirements for on-site septic systems and wells. Our staff works very hard with our clients to try and accommodate the prospective proposals but the limited lot sizes sometimes just doesn't allow us to give approvals. In many areas across all three counties, the lake properties were originally developed as summer cottages. As time went on there has been more demand for year-round housing on these lots. That has presented our staff some big challenges in trying to design septic systems to accommodate the larger homes that are proposed on these small lots.

### **General Programs**

We recently investigated a complaint from a resident at Coldwater Lake in Branch County. The complaint indicated a potential sewage leak into the lake due to a large area of sludge and a strong odor. Upon investigation in conjunction with the sewer authority and the county drain commissioner it was determined that there was no sewage leak and it appeared to be an algal bloom. Coincidentally, MDHHS had recently investigated a complaint of an algal bloom in the same area of the lake. The investigating staff sent me an email the day after our investigation informing us of their investigation. The MDHHS staff took a number of water samples from the sludge area and were able to determine that the algal bloom did not have any toxicity associated with it and reported their finding to the lake residents as well.

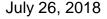
