For Pregnant, Breastfeeding or Post Partum Women, Infants & Children up to 5 years old

## Basic Foods Could Include:

- Infant formula, cereal, fruits & vegetables
- Infant meats for fully breastfed babies
- Milk, cheese, eggs, cereal, juice
- Dry beans or peas, canned beans, peanut butter
- Tuna for fully breastfeeding mothers
- Whole grain breads, tortillas, brown rice or oatmeal
- Fresh fruits and vegetables
