

**Health Officer's Report to the Board of Health for September 23, 2021**

**Agency Updates**

**Dr. Vogel's Retirement as Medical Director:** This is Dr. Vogel's final meeting as Medical Director for our Agency. He has served since October 1, 2013; a total of 8 fiscal years. I have appreciated his dedication to our local public health agency, his quick response to questions directed at him by myself and the staff, and his honest positive personality. Although we will be sad to see Dr. Vogel leave, we are confident in his replacement, Dr. Luparello. Please join me in acknowledging Dr. Vogel's service to the Branch-Hillsdale-St. Joseph Community Health Agency and thanking him for a job well done!

**Quarantine Order:** The quarantine order was updated on September 22<sup>nd</sup> to align with new K-12 quarantine guidance issued by MDHHS. The update provides students with a close contact exposure who were wearing masks the opportunity to stay in school. It is our hope that more students will be able to stay in school but we also feel it is important to give parents the opportunity to decide the best quarantine option for their student. Therefore, a parent can opt for the 10 day quarantine, 7 day quarantine with negative test, or if their student wears a mask there are options to stay in school by wearing a mask and participating in daily testing. We have also reversed our decision about home tests for release from quarantine and are now accepting those results.

**COVID Vaccine:** We are still waiting for information on booster doses and if those will be authorized. Last month I defined 3<sup>rd</sup> doses and Booster doses. We are able to provide 3<sup>rd</sup> doses now to immune compromised patients. These patients can make an appointment online using our online scheduler or go to a local pharmacy to get this 3<sup>rd</sup> dose of vaccine. There are not additional doses currently authorized for individuals that received the J&J vaccine. We also expect the Pfizer vaccine to receive Emergency Use Authorization for children 5-11 years of age sometime in mid to late October. There continue to be many locations throughout the tri-county area where COVID vaccine can be obtained. Your local health department is also present at the St. Joseph County Grange Fair this week and will be at the Hillsdale County Fair next week providing vaccine and information about health department services.

**COVID-19 Testing:** We continue to offer COVID-19 testing at our facility in Coldwater on Thursdays and on Fridays in Three Rivers and Hillsdale. Honu is providing no-cost rapid testing in addition to the PCR test. Providing this opportunity in each county involves no staff time from our Agency team and supports existing testing available in the community. This arrangement is working out well and individuals are utilizing the testing sites. We are just exploring providing additional testing opportunities in St. Joseph and Hillsdale Counties with Honu. Branch County has Honu in Coldwater at the Welcome Center 7 days a week.

**COVID-19 Data Round-Up:** All three counties remain at risk factor High due to the weekly positivity rate being above 10 and the weekly rate per 100,000 being above 100K. Positivity rate is considered underreported due to individuals choosing not to test or administering home tests and not reporting

results. I have provided screenshots of the latest data on 7-day positivity and weekly cases per 100K for each county at the end of this report.

**School Communication Re: COVID:** I am holding weekly meetings for schools to provide updates from our office and answer any questions.

**Potential COVID Staff Assistance:** We are still waiting to hear on if we will be awarded additional COVID staff assistance funded through the CDC Foundation.

**Agency Staff Wellness Day:** Made possible by a grant obtained through the Michigan Association for Local Public Health, the Agency was able to provide a day of training focused on Personal Wellbeing. All staff and contract workers with the Agency were asked to participate and our guest speaker was from Pines Behavioral Health. Our public health staff have had a very stressful last 18 months and that stress level has only increased with the Delta variant and the state pushing decision making on local health departments. This day was very much needed but I fear is inadequate to truly minister to the needs of the Agency staff.

**Board of Health Education:** Paul will be providing an overview of the Vectorborne Surveillance Grant that the Environmental Health section participated in again this year at the conclusion of the meeting.

**Local Funding for Public Health Services:** For a number of years the Agency has received funding from each county based on population. We are looking at the newly released census numbers and what that means for local funding of public health services.

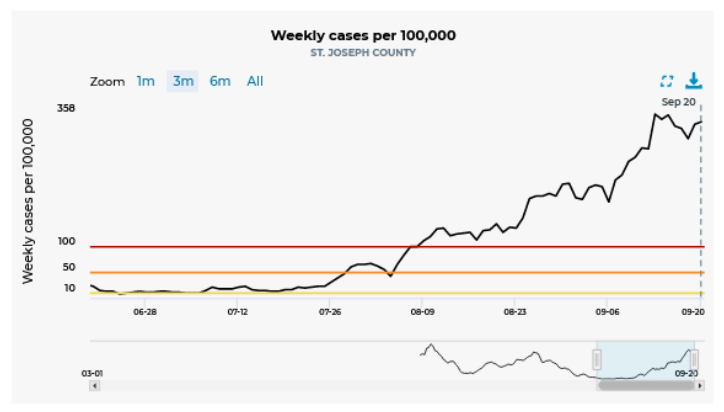

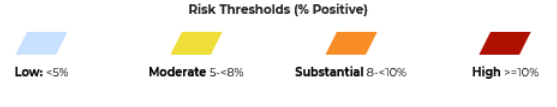

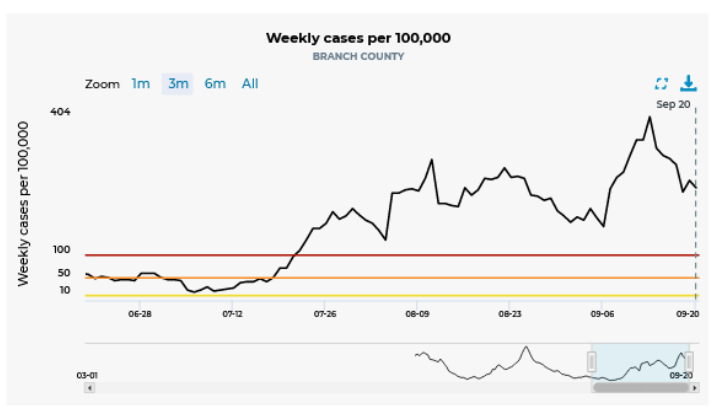

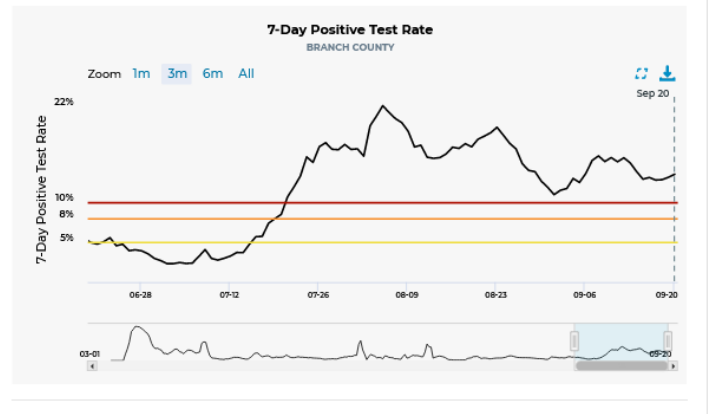

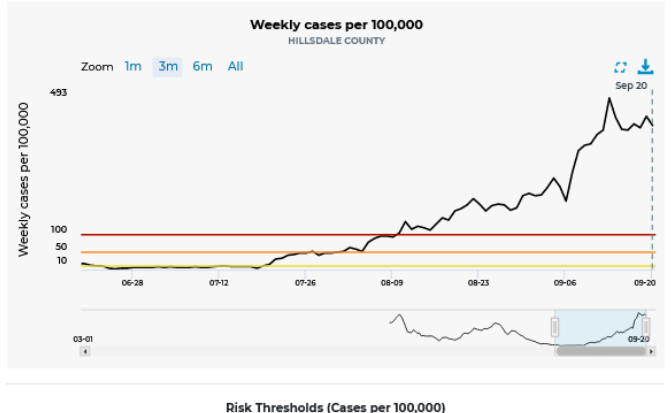

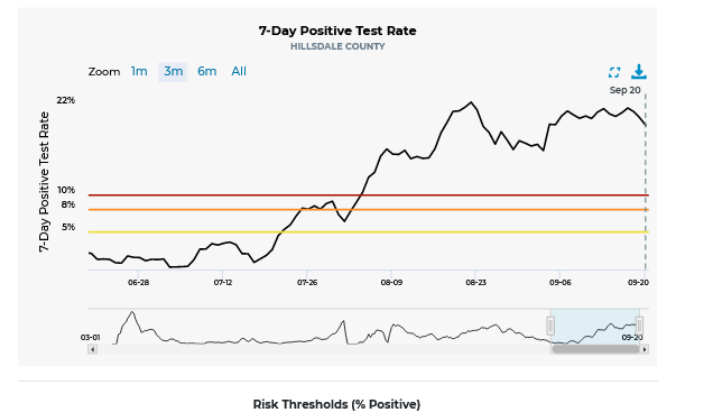

**Health Promotion & Ed. Team Activities:** This past month H. P. & Ed. Staff participated in the National Conference on Health Communication, Marketing and Media. This three-day virtual conference discussed strategies to successfully leverage partnerships to disseminate public health messaging. Presenters from the CDC, NIH, multiple state and local health departments shared their best practices in health promotion and education.

The H. P. & Ed. team is participating in the development and redesign of two coalitions in Hillsdale County. We continue to support county coalitions addressing addiction, domestic violence, child development, and access to healthcare.

We continue to work with the IT team to redesign the bhsj.org website. We look forward to what the new page will look like and how it will function.

Our team is gearing up for the St. Joseph County and Hillsdale County fairs.

**MALPH Wellbeing Grant Update:** The Agency held their Staff Wellness Day on September 10, 2021 at the ProMedica Conference Center in Coldwater. Candi Moyer, MSW from Pines Behavioral facilitated 3 sessions discussing long term effects of stress, resilience, and self-care. Team members also participated in chair yoga, Pictionary, and meditation. Overall, the group enjoyed the day and being able to gather together as an organization.

**Grant Updates:** The H.P. & Ed. team is also involved in several other ongoing grant projects and campaigns:

- **HRSA - The Rural Community Opioid Response Planning Grant:** BHSJCHA was notified that we will not be receiving Implementation funding for the Opioid Response grant. While we are disappointed, we will continue to work with partners and coalitions to address this serious health issue. Fourteen agency team members participated in NARCAN training through Cope Network of SW Michigan. NARCAN kits were provided to those who requested them and we now have kits available in three clinic offices, Coldwater, Hillsdale and Three Rivers.
- **“Wear One” Campaign:** The H.P. & Ed. Team was also able to assist our clinical staff with the “Wear One” campaign, which provides STD information and condoms for our community members at no charge.

We have partnered with Branch County PRIDE and distributed condoms at the Pride Event held on September 18, 2021 in Coldwater.

- **MPHI – “Creating an Age-Friendly Public Health System in Michigan” Update:** The collaborative team with Area Agency on Aging Region III C and Region 2 continues to review policies and identify areas of opportunity to create a friendlier public health system.
- **LARA-MRA - “Lock It Up” Marihuana Grant:** This program has completed and final reports are being submitted. The campaign provided lock boxes, educational materials and provided for a media campaign.

**COVID-19 Vaccination Efforts:** The BHSJCHA employees continue to work tirelessly in their efforts to vaccinate as many community members as possible, and to do whatever we can to support the health and safety of the individuals within our three counties. The H.P. & Ed. Team continues to identify community resources, organizations, and events in an effort to more effectively deliver our message to the community members that we serve.

In the past 4 weeks, the agency has participated in 15 community events across the three counties. The highest number of events were held in St. Joseph county in conjunction with the United Way and Access to Healthcare Committee. We are seeing slow and steady progress in reaching residents. We have held events at employers, fire stations, food distribution sites, grocery stores, schools, and soup kitchens.

**Medical Director's Final Report to the Board of Health**



### Fee Waiver Proposal

Recently our agency received a call from a citizen who is in the process of building his own home. He applied for and paid for a septic system permit approximately a year ago. As per our policy, all well and septic permits are good for 1 year after the date of issuance. The permit he applied for is due to expire soon and we sent him a letter as we do to all those permit holders, a month ahead of when the permit is due to expire. Our policy does allow permits to be extended for another for a fee of \$39.00. The citizen has not been able to complete his home project due to the shortage in building materials created by the pandemic. He fully intended to have his building projected completed in the one- year time frame but due to circumstances beyond his control that has not happened. His feeling was that the late fee that we impose for the permit renewal should be waived due to the materials shortage created by the pandemic. This brings forth another situation that has created a hardship on our citizens. I would like to propose that the agency waive our late fee on permits until the end of 2021. I contacted a couple of the larger building materials companies in our area to get a feeling for when the materials shortage may end. It seems that recently the availability of some of the building materials has been resolved, however, there are still some products that are on back order or in very short supply.

In reviewing our record for all three counties, to date we have renewed 36 septic permits since the beginning of 2021 and we have 43 septic permits that will expire but the end of the year. The agency would continue to contact the permit holders when the permits were close to expiring and we would still require them to contact us to extend the permit. However, they would not have to pay the \$39.00 for the period of time prescribed in this proposal.

## Immunization Fee Schedule Update

Trumenba is a Meningococcal Group B vaccine to help protect against meningococcal disease caused by serogroup B. **Meningococcal disease** can cause meningitis (infection of the lining of the brain and spinal cord) and infections of the blood. According to data from the CDC, even when it is treated, meningococcal disease kills 10 to 15 percent of infected people. Of those who survive, about 10 to 20 percent will suffer disabilities such as hearing loss, brain damage, kidney damage, loss of limbs, nervous system problems, or severe scars from skin grafts.

We currently offer one brand of the Meningococcal Group B vaccine (Bexsero made by GlaxoSmithKline) but several of the provider offices in the area offer the other brand, Trumenba made by Pfizer. These two vaccines are similar, but they are not interchangeable. To be fully immunized, you must have two doses of the same brand of vaccine.

Often, we have children come into our clinics who have already received one dose of the Trumenba vaccine and are due for the second dose. At this time, we are not able to offer the second dose to finish the series for them because we do not carry it. Additionally, we recently adopted some vaccines from a Vaccines for Children Program (VFC) provider in Hillsdale County that closed. There is Trumenba vaccine in this acquired inventory. We would like to be able to use that vaccine before it expires and also continue to carry it in limited quantities for both VFC and private pay usage.

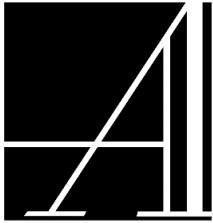
We recommend carrying limited stock of both Bexsero and Trumenba, which will allow us to continue to immunize anyone who has already started the series, as well as offering a more affordable choice. The following immunization fee schedule has been updated to include the Trumenba vaccine.

**Updates:**

1. Services to Victims of Elder Abuse Program Updates
  - We received feedback from the Division of Victim Services regarding the March 17<sup>th</sup> Contract Review. I've included the Final Report Summary for your perusal. Our team, along with Admin Services, will complete the follow-up items that are documented. Our team will also focus on any remaining recommendations that were shared and make changes accordingly. Should you wish to receive a copy of the full Final Report, please let me know and I will email it to you.
  - Our FY2022 SVEA contract is in place! Some of our marketing efforts from this fiscal year will also continue into this fall... Stay tuned, you may see a billboard or two pop up across the two-county area that look familiar!
2. The personnel search continues for a full-time Nurse Care Consultant and full-time Program Specialist...
3. We are working to prepare for the end of FY21 and the start of FY22. At this time of the year, it is always very intense as we are: reviewing provider budget submissions, issuing contract renewals, reporting on programs and making sure we maximize all grant awards.
4. Our FY22 Annual Implementation Plan was presented to the Michigan Commission on Services to the Aging on Friday, September 17<sup>th</sup>. Most of the highlights I shared were surrounding our COVID response efforts including; distribution of PPE, the volume of calls our small team of 7 supported, the food distribution & logistics we coordinated as well as the collaborative partnerships that have continued as a result of our work. Because many of the Commissioners are new, I offered additional perspective about our unique structure as being a part of local public health.

Speaking of our structure, I shared with the Commissioners that our structure gives us a unique ability to respond to the needs of our community. Very soon our AAA IIIIC team will be working with the CHA mobile unit staff to contact and support vaccination efforts for residents of nearly 50 Adult Foster Care Homes and Homes for the Aged across Branch & St. Joseph County. This project is just beginning and is at the request of the Public Health Administration and Aging & Adult Services Agency. We will ONLY have success with this effort because of the relationship we have with our local health department. AFC's and HFA's are, honestly, a group of entities whom AAA's and health departments we have limited interactions with. Traditionally, AAA's don't give immunizations or have mobile clinics. Collaboration, communication and coordination will be a "breeze" in our region in comparison to other area agency regions across the state. I will be glad to share additional updates & feedback from the Commission Meeting at the BOH meeting.

## **Personal Health and Disease Prevention: September 23, 2021**

### **Communicable Disease:**

I wish I had better news to share but our lives here have become totally consumed with increasing Covid-19 cases every single day. It's definitely more intense this time around and it's very much concerning seeing these high numbers in the warmer months. I think it makes all of us wonder about what the winter months will bring with various illness. The phone calls are overwhelming and in general very shocking to hear that the majority of people still do not know Covid-19 guidance after 18 months of this in our lives. We receive phone calls daily regarding isolation/quarantine guidance, return to work/school, employer guidance, vaccination questions, and more. We did recently onboard a new case investigator which will be helpful but at this time we are still completely saturated. In the month of August alone we responded to over 1100 confirmed or probable cases. These numbers obviously do not include people who do not get tested or one of the more recent issues we have been experiencing is lack of at-home test and antigen reporting.

The schools continue to be an on-going struggle. We evolve every day in our response with this population so we can better fit the needs of students, parents, and educators.

We have hired a Covid Response Coordinator. Her name is Kim and we are so excited to have her join us! Her support will be so helpful during this time.

### **Immunizations/STD/HIV:**

It's back to school season so we have been getting kids caught up with routine immunizations along with scheduling waiver appointments.

We continue to hold our weekly vaccination clinics in house at each office. We are looking at how we can incorporate flu shots with our Covid vaccination clinics as well. Our offices have received private flu and VFC vaccine. At the Covid clinics we are offering 3<sup>rd</sup> doses to the immune compromised. We are still waiting on information for booster shots.

We will be attending the Hillsdale County and St. Joseph County fairs.

### **Women, Infant, and Children (WIC):**

Mackenzie (our WIC Coordinator) has been working with Great Start Collaborative programs to promote and educate a wider range of people on what we offer for WIC. The goal is to improve enrollment in the program and continue to spread awareness.

We are still in a hybrid model of serving WIC clients at this time.

Our hiring journey for multiple positions at the health department continues but we have been able to secure a few more people for our WIC roles.

### **Children's Special Health Care Services (CSHCS), Lead, and Hearing & Vision:**

Hearing and vision techs have returned and are back in the schools providing screening.

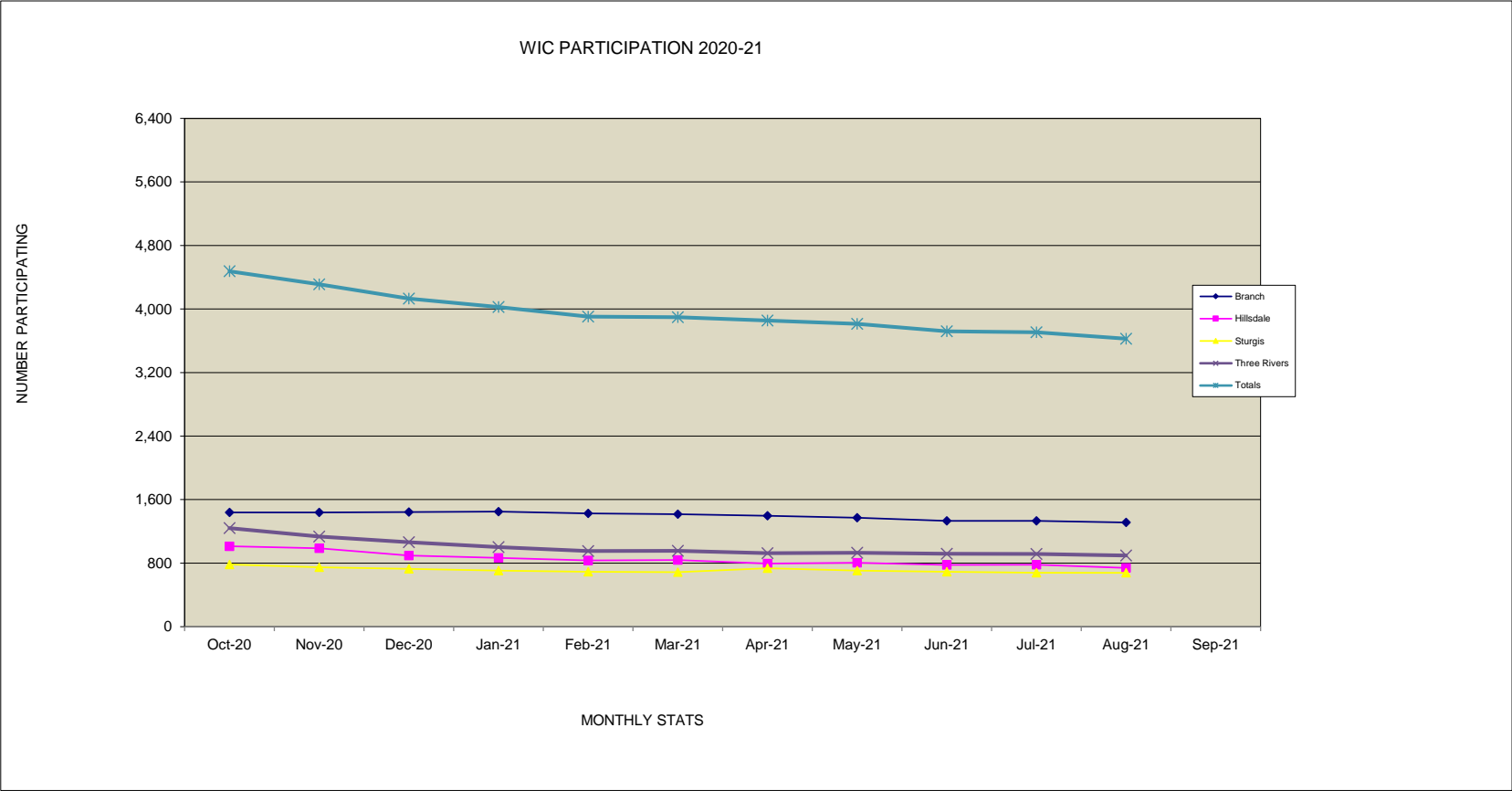

### **Food Service Sanitation**

Our food service staff had an exceptionally busy month in August. There was a total of 87 routine inspections performed along with 48 temporary food inspections and 15 STFU inspections. The spike in the temporary and STFU inspections was in part due to the Branch County Fair but also attributed to a large number of festivals and other events that featured food vendors.

September will be another busy month as our staff will be getting back into the schools to do inspections on the food service operations. We have instructed the food staff to remind the food service operators about the quarantine requirements related to Covid 19 in all three counties. We have also sent out an email blast to the food service operators, the quarantine orders put in place by our health officer.



### **Well and Septic**

Over the past months our Non-Community Water Supply Coordinator has been working with a private school in efforts to obtain compliance with the mandated water sampling requirements. The school has not been taking the samples required for non-community water supplies. Depending on the history of the water sampling, these types of facilities may have to test for bacteria either quarterly or monthly and test for nitrates at least yearly. Because of this school's lack of sampling this school has been in non-compliance for many months. David Wagoner, our Non-Community Water Supply coordinator has worked tirelessly trying to get compliance but thus far has been unsuccessful. Due to the long-standing status of non-compliance, Dave had pushed the issue forward to our partners at EGLE. They too have not been able to obtain compliance so they have pushed the issue forward to the EPA for assistance who have agreed to conduct an inspection of the facility and discuss corrective actions with the school. The EPA subsequently reached out to EGLE and BHSJ to participate in a pre-inspection discussion which took place on September 8. During that meeting we discussed the strategies that might be most helpful to try to convince the school of the importance of the water sampling requirements. The EPA has scheduled their inspection for September 29 at which time they will be collecting bacteriological samples and a nitrate sample as well as verifying proper construction of the water system.

### **General Programs**

All of our seasonal inspections (campgrounds, children's camps, swimming pools and septage trucks/land application sites) have been completed for the year with the exception of two campgrounds. The remaining campground inspections are at the St. Joseph County Fairgrounds and the Hillsdale County Fairgrounds which will be done this month during the County Fairs.

**Food Inspection Codes:**

P-This indicates a priority violation which is a violation which includes a quantifiable measure to show control of hazards such as cooking, cooling, reheating and handwashing. It is in general terms a violation that can potentially lead directly to an illness.

Pf-This is a priority foundation violation which is a violation that supports a priority violation. For example, the lack of soap or towels at a handwash sink is a Pf. This supports the priority violation of not washing hands.

C-This is a core violation-This is an item the usually relates to general sanitation, operational controls and maintenance of facilities and equipment.
